

DR. ADRON DORAN "Fishers of Men" Sunday, 7:30 p.m.

Dr. Adron Doran began preaching in 1928 at age 18 and currently is conducting revival meetings, research and lectures on the Restoration Movement.

He has preached, led gospel meetings and lectured in 30 states and served as a minister for congregations in Kentucky and Tennessee.

Doran is a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives. He was president of Morehead State University in Kentucky for 23 years. He served as a high school teacher, basketball coach and principal for 15 years, and he also has been director of teacher education and certification for the Kentucky State Department. He served as secretary of the Kentucky Council on Public Higher Education, and he currently is a member of the Board of Trustees for Freed-Hardeman and International Bible Colleges.

He has been selected as Kentuckian of the Year and as a Distinguished Alumnus of three colleges

and universities, among other honors.

He graduated from Freed-Hardeman College, received bachelor of science and master of arts degrees from Murray State University and earned a doctor of education degree from the University of Kentucky. He holds honorary doctorates from five colleges and universities.

His wife is Mignon (McClain) Doran.



DR. JIM MANKIN "The Rich Fool" Sunday, 7:30 p.m.

Dr. Jim Mankin is chairman of ACU's Department of Undergraduate Bible and Ministry in the College of Biblical Studies.

He came to ACU in 1987, and he teaches ministry, worship, church growth, Christian leadership and freshman Bible. From 1979-86 he served as pulpit minister for Madison Church of Christ in Tennessee, the largest congregation among churches of Christ in the world. He also preached six years at Central Church of Christ in Cincinnati, Ohio, and 13 years at Central Church of Christ in Chattanooga, Tenn.

Mankin has led tours to Europe and the Middle East, and he is interested in the Restoration

Movement.

He received a bachelor's degree from David Lipscomb University, a master's in Christian education from Emory University and a doctor of ministry degree from Fuller Theological Seminary.

Mankin and his wife, the former Delores Burch,

have three children: Alice, Jeff and Ben.



DR. FRANK PACK "The Waiting Father" Sunday, 7:30 p.m.

Dr. Frank Pack is a distinguished professor emeritus of religion at Pepperdine University's Seaver College.

He has taught at the university level for 49 years, including teaching at David Lipscomb, Pepperdine, ACU and the University of Southern California. He served as chairman of the religion department at Pepperdine University from 1963-77 and as dean of the Graduate School from 1967-78.

Pack also has preached regularly for congregations in Chattanooga, Tenn.; Nashville, Tenn.; Burbank, Calif.; Abilene; and Los Angeles. He has spent

considerable time in evangelistic work.

He has written for several Christian publications and has authored nine books. Twenty-five of his former students wrote an honorary volume of sermons in his honor, and a group of colleagues wrote a series of essays, *Johannine Studies*, to honor him.

ACU established the Frank Pack Distinguished Professorship of New Testament in his honor.

He and his wife, Della (Carlton) Pack, twice served Pepperdine as faculty directors for American young people studying in Heidelberg, Germany.



DR. KREGG HOOD "Ministers of Mercy" Monday, 9:45 a.m.

Dr. Kregg Hood serves as minister for South MacArthur Church of Christ in Irving.

He previously served as minister for the College Church in Oklahoma City. He has been associate minister at the Broadway congregation in Lubbock and an instructor in the Bible department at Lubbock Christian University.

Hood has been a missionary to Limerick, Ireland, and has served as a minister at Military Parkway Church of Christ in Dallas and for the Culpepper Mountain congregation near Clinton, Ark.

He is heavily involved in educational interests both professionally and through his ministry. Hood is a member of Phi Delta Kappa and the Christian Education Association. He was cowinner of the 1989 Christian Education Award.

He received a bachelor's degree in Bible, biblical languages and mathematics from Harding University, a master's degree in religious communication and a master of missiology degree from ACU, and a doctorate in instructional communication from Texas Tech University.

He and his wife, the former Karen Hahn, have one daughter, Kalah.

Dr. Tony Ash is the pulpit minister for Minter Lane Church of Christ in Abilene and a professor of Bible at ACU.

He has preached since 1954, serving 11 different churches in Georgia, California and Texas. He recently returned to the Minter Lane congregation, where he served from 1966-72, after preaching at the South 11th and Willis congregation for four years.

Ash has conducted evangelistic work in more than 35 states and eight foreign countries. He has led more than 400 meetings and extended lectureships and has spoken at more than 45 colleges and universities. He has written eight books and has published articles in various religious publications.

Ash returned to teach at ACU in 1985, after 10 years as the A.B. Cox Professor at the Institute for Christian Studies in Austin. He also taught at ACU from 1962-72 and at Pepperdine

University from 1972-75.

He attended the University of Oregon for two years and received an associate of arts degree from Florida Christian College, a bachelor of science degree in speech from Florida State University, a master of arts degree in Old Testament from ACU and a Ph.D. in church history from the University of Southern California.

He has worked for Herald of Truth writing scripts and providing guest segments since 1977.

Douglas F. Parsons has served nine years as pulpit evangelist for Golf Course Road Church of Christ in Midland, one of the largest congregations among churches of Christ in the United States.

During his ministry at Golf Course Road, the church has grown from 800 to more than 1,450

members.

He began preaching in 1960 and has since preached and lectured in 37 states and 12 nations: Mexico, Nicaragua, Peru, Uruguay, Brazil, Venezuela, Puerto Rico, Canada, Germany, England, Greece and Bermuda. He has been a featured lecturer at each of the Christian colleges.

Parsons has served as a minister for churches in Thomas, Okla.; Winfield, Kan.; Humboldt, Tenn.; Overland Park, Kan.; and Del City, Okla. He has spoken on a weekly TV program in the Permian Basin and on several radio stations.

He is the author of Victorious Christian Living, Dynamic Living for Difficult Days and Timeless Truths for Tough Times. He also is a staff writer for the publications Image, Power for Today, Preacher's Periodical and 20th Century Christian.

Parsons attended Southern Methodist University and received a bachelor's degree from Oklahoma Christian College and a master's degree from the Harding Graduate School of Religion.

Dr. Howard Norton is chairman of the Bible division at Oklahoma Christian College and editor of the Christian Chronicle, an international

newspaper of the churches of Christ.

He has been preaching since 1952, when he was in high school. He worked from 1961-77 as a missionary in Sao Paulo, Brazil. While there, Norton did local church work, taught in the Sao Paulo Preacher Training School and served for several years as director of that school.

He has preached for local congregations in Lingleville and Houston, Texas, and Oklahoma City, Okla. He has spoken at lectureships for various Christian universities including Pepperdine, Harding and David Lipscomb, and he has been a featured speaker for the Pan American Lectures.

A prolific writer, he has written two books, various book chapters and numerous articles, manuals and tracts and has served as staff writer for such publications as Power for Today and Contact. He was the associate editor of the Bible correspondence course titled What the Bible Says.
