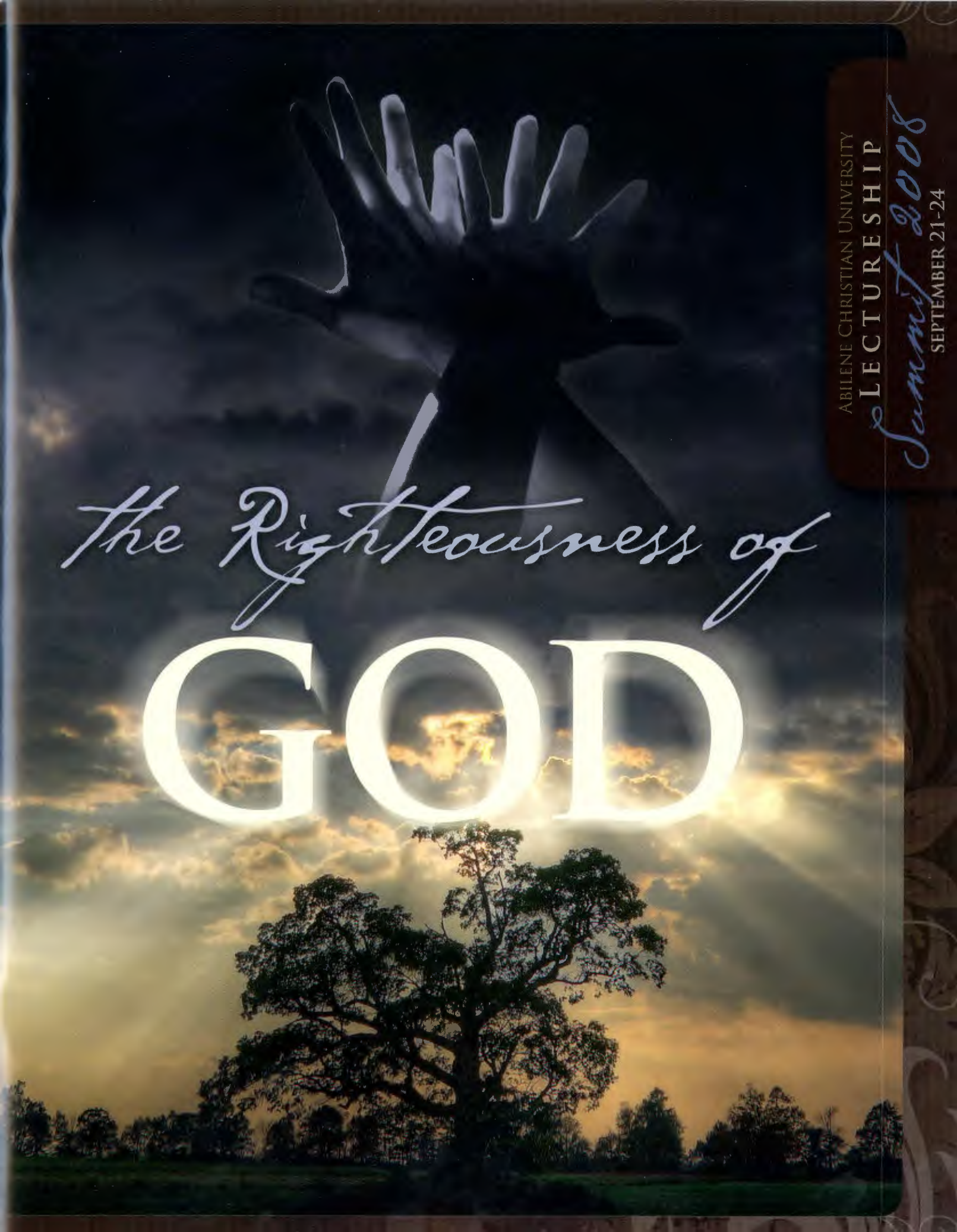

An authority on Islamic issues with expertise in Shariah law, he has been called to brief world leaders in several nations.
