PLACE: Abilene Christian University, Main Room of McGlothlin Campus Center

REGISTRATION: Friday, July 22, 1:00 p.m., Main Room of McGlothlin Campus Center

COST: \$10.00 per person, payable at Registration. Fee is the same whether you register for one session or for the entire Conference. Please do not send payment in advance.

ROOMS: Dormitory housing is available, as space allows, on a first-requested, first-assigned basis. All rooms are air-conditioned. The fee is \$15.00 per person, flat fee, regardless of how many nights you stay. Please pay at the dormitory as you arrive on campus (no advance payments). Rooms are equipped with two single beds. Linens and a limited supply of towels are furnished. You will need to bring your pillow. No charge is made for children in the room with parents, if the family furnishes cots and bedding.

Those desiring dormitory housing should make their request in writing immediately, as space is limited. If you plan to stay for Bible Teachers Workshop, Elders Workshop, or Ministers Renewal Workshop, you need to notify us of your plans at the time your housing request is made. Please give all details, including name, home address, telephone, and time of arrival. Check out time must be before the 1:45 p.m. session on Sunday.
