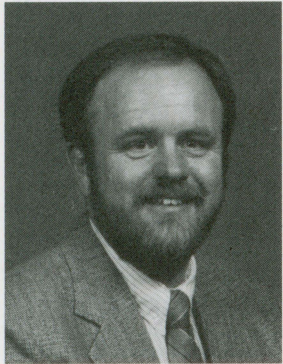

DR. BILL WEBER NAMED ACADEMIC DEAN

We are pleased to announce the Board of Trustees has called Dr. Bill Weber to be the new Academic Dean at Nebraska Christian College, and that he has accepted the position.

Dr. Weber brings to the position a deep commitment to the Kingdom of God, to NCC, and to higher education. He has earned a Doctor of Philosophy degree from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. His missions work in South Africa was heavily involved in discipling people. He has always been an educator.

He has demonstrated in his two years as Professor of Missions a deep concern for the education of laborers for the fields "white unto the harvest". He has also demonstrated a strong administrative talent. These talents, his education, life experience and commitments make him the right person for Academic Dean of NCC.

Dr. Weber will continue to teach six hours per semester in his field. Mrs. Weber, NCC's Alumni Director, will teach one mission course this fall. We also plan to have a furloughed missionary teach at least one semester of every four. We believe this will be a very effective program for mission students. Dr. Weber will provide the continuity a successful program requires, and a missionary on furlough will bring the "immediacy" of the field to the students.

Dr. Weber is married to Verna (McVey). They have two children - Mrs. Miki Brooks, a junior at NCC, and Donovan, who will be a freshman at NCC this fall.

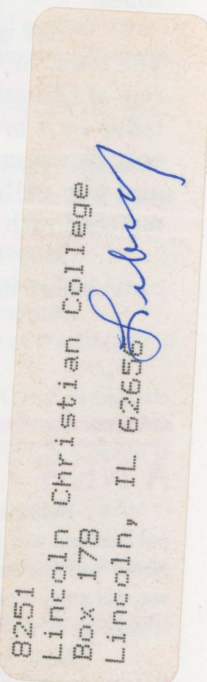
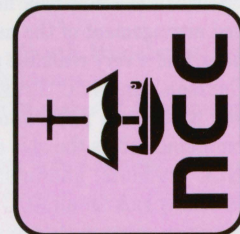

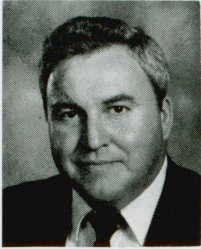

The writer of Ecclesiastes asked, "Is there anything new under the sun?" He found there wasn't much, and so do I.

I have been reading letters, board meeting minutes, and various other documents of the 1940's and 1950's, relating to NCC. The issues of finding personnel was constantly before the

Board in that era. We read of students who excelled and those who didn't. We read of the constant tension of trying to accomplish great things for the Kingdom of God with limited financial resources.

AND YET...

The men and women of the 40's and 50's persevered. They continued to give of themselves, their time, and their treasure. The students worked with the Altamira Church of Christ to remodel and re-roof part of their church building that had been built more than thirty years ago.

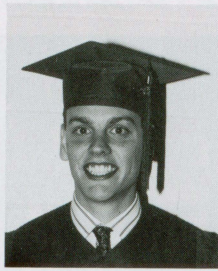

The students returned to classes after spring break tired from work and travel but refreshed from a great experience in cross-cultural ministry.

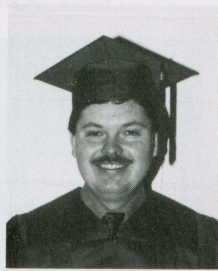
