DWAYNE AND MARIA JOHNSON TO JOIN COLLEGE STAFF

After several months of searching, evaluating resumes, and interviewing candidates, the college is pleased to announce that Dwayne and Maria Johnson have been called by the Board of Trustees to serve as Director of Business and Administrative Affairs and Librarian respectively.

Maria will begin her ministry with the college this summer. For the past three years, she has served as Law Library Director for a thirty member law firm in Washington, DC. She has

been responsible for establishing and implementing library policy in all areas of the law library, including a \$150,000 budget. Her education credentials include a Bachelor of Arts degree (English Major) from the University of Maryland and the Master of Library Science degree (Reference Librarianship Major) from the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC. She is a member of the American Association of Law Librarians and Law Librarians' Society of Washington DC.

In a letter explaining why she was interested in NCC's librarian position, she wrote:

Working for NCC is a challenging idea for me. I want to be a part of NCC's planning... to ensure the library is a viable, integral part of the academics for both students and faculty... Libraries should be learning centers where information is free-flowing, where books are off the shelves being used, where non-print sources of information are recognized, where an exchange of ideas is encouraged and real learning is fostered.

I think you can see why we are excited about Mrs. Johnson's becoming the college's second degreed librarian.

Lieutenant Colonel Dwayne "Derby" Johnson is completing twenty years of service in the U. S. Army, presently serving as Intelligence Officer in the Intelligence Agency at the Pentagon. He is responsible for reviewing the Army, Air Force, and Navy service budgets to ensure that the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff's intelligence requirements are being met worldwide. He has also been involved in the education side of the Army, having served as instructor for the U. S. Army Engineer School at Fort Belvoir, Virginia. Because of his commitments to the service, he will not be able to accept his role as our business manager until January, 1990.

Lt. Col. Johnson received his B. S. in Business Administration from Wayne State College, and an M. S. in Business Administration from Boston University. He graduated with honors from the U. S. Army Command and General Staff College. He has received numerous commendations and recommendations from his commanding officers and professional colleagues. We are extremely fortunate to have a man with Dwayne's qualifications and experience join our college staff.

Dwayne and Maria (Stueland) attended Nebraska Christian College in the midsixties and have had a dream for several years of being able to return to serve the

THE LIBRARY: KEY TO A QUALITY EDUCATION

Think of all you would have learned if you were 2,500 years old! Since none of us experience that much time in the school of experience, we depend upon libraries to contain the wisdom and follies

of the generations and make them available for us to use.

Next to the teacher, the library is the single greatest learning resource available to the student.

The library is the student's toolbox, containing both general and specific tools to help the worker be more effective in his work. As the mechanic with only a few tools is severely limited in what he can do, so is the student without a good library.

NCC's library catalogs over 22,000 volumes, 180 periodicals, and receives hundreds of mission and church

newsletters. Because of the present knowledge and technology explosion, hundreds of new books, tapes, cassettes, and other materials need to be added each year.

A special feature of our library is its large collection of original editions of Christian Churches/Churches of Christ literature. These materials help our students understand their spiritual heritage and promote the principles of New Testament Christianity in the generations to come.

The college's commitment to a quality library is also seen in its expansion of facilities. With special funds given for this purpose, a new addition will be built this summer that will more than double its present size. This will make it possible for the library to more effectively serve the student, expand its collection of "tools", and display special collections which are now stored in boxes (e.g., the Guy B. Dunning Memorial Library; the Carroll Gunderson Bible Collection; and the Loren Swedburg Library.)
