RANDY DAWKINS CALLED TO BECOME PROFESSOR OF CHURCH MUSIC



Randy Dawkins, Associate Minister of Music and Administration of the Northwest Christian Church, Tampa, Florida, has accepted a call from the Board of Trustees to become NCC's Professor of Church Music.

Dawkins will fill the vacancy left when David Burkum ended his five-year ministry with the college to become minister of the Church of Christ at Howard Lake, Minnesota.

Mr. Dawkins is completing his third year on the staff of the Northwest Church. Prior to joining that staff, he was professor of music for two years at Artesia Christian College, Artesia, New Mexico. Most of his seventeen years of

local church ministry have been as a minister of music and youth at churches in Georgia, Florida, and Illinois. He has led music for over 90 revivals, conventions, and special programs in thirteen states. He plays and has taught guitar, saxaphone, oboe, clarinet, string bass, mallet percussion and has taught private voice lessons for five years.

A native of Florida and a graduate of Atlanta Christian College, Mr. Dawkins has also taken extensive work in music education from Jacksonville University, Valencia Community College, and the University of Central Florida.

Nebraska Christian College has a rich and distinguished history of music excellence and innovation built first by Lowell Burkum and continued and expanded by David Burkum. When looking for a replacement, we sought someone with proven music abilities, a strong experience in the local church music ministry, someone who shared NCC's philosophy of education and commitment to excellence in the Bible college environment, and someone who was a servant leader. Randy Dawkins meets those criteria and more. We look forward to his joining our college family.

Randy and his wife, Valerie, and their children, Jody (age 13), Lynessa (age 11), and Jason (age 9) plan to move to Norfolk sometime around July 1. Randy will arrive earlier in June to work with Lowell Burkum directing one of the New Way Singer groups.

PARSONS COMPLETE BEST SEASON EVER



The NCC Parsons have just completed their finest season in the history of the school. After finishing the regular season with a record of 19-7, they went on to take the Midwest Christian College Conference Tournament Championship. NCC's first ever conference championship qualified them to play in the National Bible College Athletic Association Division I Tournament in Dallas, Texas. They also finished second in the conference during the regular season with a record of 10-4.

Troy Justice and Mike Slagle were both named to the All-Conference team, and Troy was named NBCAA All-American. Troy also became the all-time leading scorer for NCC with 1,741 points.

For the third consecutive year, a team from the Southeast Christian Church, Englewood, Colorado (last year's NACC National Bible Bowl Champs), has won NCC's annual Bible Bowl Tournament. They came from behind in the championship game to edge out a fine team from Longmont, Colorado, representing First Christian Church and Rocky Mountain Christian Church.

Over 200 youth and sponsors, representing 23 churches in seven states, were on campus for this two-day event, March 18-19. The questions this year covered material form the book of Acts and I Corinthians, 1-6. Once again, Professor William C. Miller wrote the nearly 300 toss-up questions and three to four times that many bonus questions for the tournament.

Faculty, staff, and students all get involved in the numerous responsibilities necessary to help make the tournament run smoothly - quizmasters, scorekeepers, board operators, tallying and posting scores, repairing buzzerboards, and helping the 36 teams get to their next room for another round of competition.

Three individual Bible Bowlers were also honored for attaining the highest scores on a quiz testing their knowledge of the text for this year. They were Adam Young, Englewood, Colorado; Corene Runner, Owatonna, Minnesota; and John Thomas, Englewood, Colorado.


A MINISTRY OF VOLUNTEERS

The T.J.T.A. is designed to serve as an aid to counselors in measuring a number of personality traits which bear upon a couple's personal, social, marital, and parental adjustment. It provides in visual form what a person's feelings are about himself/herself at the time the questions are answered. The training is also intended to serve as a "refresher course" for those already using the T.J.T.A.

Dr. Brown is an approved trainer for the use of this counseling tool.
