PROFESSOR DAVID BURKUM ACCEPTS NEW MINISTRY CHALLENGE

After five years of faithful service as professor of church music, David Burkum has accepted a call to the Howard Lake Church of Christ, Howard Lake, Minnesota, as minister. He will begin serving there in June.

During his tenure with the college, Professor Burkum was innovative in his approach to developing a quality church music program and creative in directing NCC's choral groups and gospel music teams. Most of the programs sung by the "Enthusiastics" were his original compositions.

In his letter of resignations, Brother Burkum reflected on his ministry at NCC:

"The past five years of my ministry have been the fullest and richest I have known. I have had the privilege of being part of a meaningful and significant purpose that has both taxed and contributed to my personal energies and abilities. I know that God's will for my life has been served and directed during my time at NCC."


Accepting this call will also allow him additional opportunity to expand his music ministry. Reflecting on these possibilities, he says:

"In addition to the challenge of local church ministry, I am hopeful that this opportunity will allow more time for the nurturing of my family and for my music writing. Eventually, I intend to give concerts and/or music seminars one or two times a month. I should also be able to increase the amount of music I submit for publication.

Good news! The Phil Casev family expects to be relocated from Santiago, Chile, to Norfolk by August 1 to assume new responsibilities as NCC's first fulltime professor of missions.

The decision to call Brother Casey is an act of faith on the part of the college. A faculty position at the college costs about \$30,000, including salary and benefits, teaching aids and supplies, secretarial assistance, and assorted other expenses. We are appealing to friends and supporters of the Caseys and our college friends who have encouraged us to call a missions faculty member to underwrite the missions professor's costs with special designated contributions.

We certainly believe that Brother Casey's decision to teach at Nebraska Christian College will make an expansion of his ministry to the world. Now he will have opportunity to recruit and train what we believe will be a growing number of men and women who will take the Gospel to the world. We are convinced that God is able to do through His people whatever is necessary when His people do His will.

The Parsons of Nebraska Christian College finished off another excellent season by participating in the National Bible College Athletic Association Division I National Tournament in Minneapolis, Minnesota. The Parsons were Division II champions last year but qualified to play in the tougher Division I tournament.

The Parsons finished the year with an overall record of 16-13 and another third place finish in the Midwest Christian College Conference. Individual honors went to Jeff Ballard (2nd Team All-Conference) and Troy Justice (1st Team All-Conference). Troy also set a single season scoring mark by pouring in 525 points which surpasses the old mark of 512 by Pat Bohall.

Hopes are already high for next season as the majority of the team returns.

For nine years, we have concentrated in these annual seminars on how to help others who are hurting. This year, we are going to focus on the "helper" and his/her family.

The objective of this year's seminar is to help bring some order to the life, family, and ministry of the Christian counselor. Dr. Bare will lead in lecture and discussion on topics such as:

- Personal Time/Stress Management

Garland Bare served on the mission field in Thailand from 1951 to 1974. Since returning to the states, he has developed a valuable ministry along with his medical practice at the University of Nebraska. He has been instrumental in starting a Christian fellowship of medical students and also works part-time in family practice with a group of doctors who take time periodically to serve on the mission field. He also served as medical director of the University Health Center from 1978 to 1981.
