Feb. 26th 1915.

Dear Bro. Colson:-

There is a preacher visiting here in Jacksonville. I think his name is Herzog and that he is from Hiram, Ohio. He has been out twice to hear me, but I feel sure he is depressive from what I can learn. Understood he has never met with the brethren on Lord's day.

The last time he was out he asked me about Gainesville and who he could write to. I gave him your name and told him I preached for you last Sunday.

He talked like he wanted to visit there, and said he meant to look out for a place for some relatives, I believe he said a brother-in-law.

I was sorry I did not ask him if his brother-in-law was with us or the depressives. If he comes back I will.

But I thought I better write you the state of the case for he may not come back. And I would not want you to be deceived. He may be a nice man and I expect he is but that is neither here nor there when it comes to teaching. Of course, it will not be necessary
