As you know the Gainesville brethern are few in numbers, and not by any means wealthy, and we have not yet finished paying for our church house, but we are doing and will do the best we can in this matter of donations to Dixieland College, and would not ask anyone else to give more than they wish to give freely and cheerfully "as to the Lord" and not with respect to what men will say.
