

Estate Planning Notes

LIFETIME GIFTS TO YOUR FAMILY CAN SAVE TAXES

If you are financially able to do so, you will generally save estate taxes by giving gifts to family members and friends during your lifetime.

You are allowed by the government to give up to \$3,000 annually, tax free, to as many as you choose. This amount can be doubled to \$6,000 if one spouse agrees to let the other use his or her exclusion.

This can be repeated each year as long as you can afford to do it. What this does is, it cuts down the total size of the estate and saves final estate taxes and administrative costs.

Your charitable gifts will do the same thing. And there is **no limitation on the size of your charitable gift**. They are immune from gift taxes. The government allows this to encourage gifts to institutions like ours.

Your charitable gifts during life time have an added advantage — they qualify for an income tax charitable deduction. So you save on income taxes as well as estate taxes by your life time gift to the College.

In this way you exercise your Christian Stewardship, support the Lord's cause and save taxes as well.

Thank God that we live in America where we are encouraged by our government's laws to do so.

The Fremont Community Christian Church (located at 8th and C Streets) called Kent and Tami to minister with them this fall.
