

#### Estate Planning Notes

A few days ago I was speaking with a man about estates and taxes and he observed "It is getting about impossible to pass on your estate to your family without taxes consuming a great share of it." I had to agree. It is true unless you do some thoughtful estate planning to avoid many of those taxes.

The most important part of your estate plan is your will.

By a will, you, rather than the state, will determine what will be done with your assets.

You name your own executor who will manage and settle your estate. You can save considerable fees by naming your spouse or an adult son or daughter as executor.

Through your will you can create trusts for your spouse, children and others that will save taxes and protect their assets.

You can make charitable gifts by a will. The federal government encourages gifts to our College by granting an estate tax charitable deduction. This would apply to states as well.

Another important consideration might be life time charitable giving.

If you can afford to part with some of your assets you can save estate taxes, income taxes and probate costs by giving your charitable contributions now instead of through your will. Gifts now are not included in your taxable or probate estate. Also, you can have the pleasure of seeing your gift working for the Lord right now. In addition you receive an income tax charitable deduction, which, depending upon your tax bracket, can save considerable taxes the year of the gift.

Even if you cannot afford to part with some of your assets, and if you intend to give to our institution through your will, you, could make a charitable gift now and receive income for life. In this way you still save estate, income and possible capital gains taxes.

There are many other ways through proper estate planning to reduce taxes and administrative costs and accomplish your desires concerning your estate. I would be happy to visit with you about it. Just give me a call.
