Estate Planning Notes

Warning: No Estate Planning can be dangerous to your wealth.

Good estate planning involves (1) creating, conserving and using wealth to attain maximum benefits now, during disability and at retirement. It also involves (2) discovering and implementing the best plans to pass wealth to family members, charities and others during life and at death — with minimum shrinkage caused by taxes and inflation.

Estate planning is important for the wealthy but it is equally important for those of "comfortable" and "average" means.

With the 1976 Tax law the Estate tax exemption has been increased from the old \$60,000 figure. Beginning in 1977 every estate had a credit equal to an exemption of \$120,666. This exemption increases each year to 1981 according to the following schedule:

 \$134,000

 1979
 \$147,333

 1980
 \$161,563

 1981
 \$175,625

This has been helpful, but at today's inflation prices it doesn't take much property to exceed this exemption and move into a high tax rate on the balance of your estate.

By thoughtful use of a will, chariable gifts and Trusts you can avoid excessive shrinkage of your estate through high taxes and can accomplish your desires for your family.
