

OFF CAMPUS CLASSES 1978

In past years the College has conducted evening classes in surrounding areas: Council Bluffs, Omaha, Sioux City, Lincoln, Lexington, Burwell and Ord - classes for Bible students, teachers, ministers, elders and others. The fee charged (\$8.00 - non-credit) for the courses has not covered actual costs to the College, but this has not been viewed with alarm since in the eyes of the administration, the classes are a service to the churches.

For the last two years, however, rising expenses of operation have placed the total cost many hundreds of dollars above fee income. With this in mind, we face some hard decisions. We still feel that if we can provide needed help for Christians in area churches we want to do so, even at cost to the school. But we would like to close the gap in the light of our policy of a tight budget and responsible use of all funds.

Therefore we would like to announce that churches desiring to make use of this program contact the College, providing the following information

- 1. Courses desired. Commonly we supply two.
- Personnel desired if you have a preference.
- 3. Indication that enrollment will be in the number of 50 or more for the two classes.
