Dear Brother Prevatt:-

Yours of the 13th instant received and noted. I am very much in need of funds at present, and as I helped Glenn out when he was here and without money or anything, and the time has almost run out in which the account is good, I will have to insist upon its payment.

I know you have continually told me ever since you were informed as to this indebtedness, that you were going to pay it as soon as you are able, and I am sorry that you have never had that much money since two years ago, and I suppose you will think hard of me, because, I am now insisting upon the payment of this amount, but certainly there is another side to this proposition. I was glad to help Glenn at that time and suppose I would help him again, and I think that the fellowship that I rendered to your son, is worthy of your most earnest efforts to repay, especially, when I am in need of financial assistance.

Perhaps his mother would be willing to pay the amount if the matter was brought to her attention, and if you cannot pay it yourself, will ask that you refer the whole matter to sister Prevatt. I should not be kept out of this amount any longer. With kindest personal feelings, I remain,
