### Life Income Gifts

It is possible to give a gift that will provide you a sizeable income tax deduction and a good income for the rest of your life. This can be done through a unitrust, an Annuity, or other trust agreement.

In each case you receive a fixed amount each year as long as you live. The amount is determined by your age, in the case of the annuity, the amount given or the agreed rate.

In every case you get an immediate income tax charitable deduction in the year you create the trust. Secondly, in the case of a unitrust, if you fund the trust with appreciated securities, there is no capital gains tax to be paid. Your income from the Annuity trust is partially exempt from income tax, too.


