

### Estate Planning Notes

GIFTS TO NEBRASKA CHRISTIAN COLLEGE REDUCE YOUR TAXES

Our tax laws are very generous to people who support charitable, nonprofit organizations. This generosity is expressed in the form of special tax deductions.

Certainly tax deductions will not motivate people to give but they are an encouragement to those who have a desire to support the College and other charitable efforts. Those who see the need for a growing, dedicated ministry and who desire to support this program, through the favorable tax laws are able to give even more. For instance - if you are in the 30% tax bracket and give \$1,000 to the College, the savings in taxes makes the cost of the gift to you only \$700.00. The \$300 is the tax reduction from the government. The percentage of reduction is determined by the particular tax bracket you occupy.

The same is true of your estate, too. Your bequests to charity will reduce the amount of tax your estate must pay if its value is beyond the allowed tax credit.

Your desire to share with the College is the most important factor. But the tax benefits set up by the government encourage you to give extensive thought as to the best way to give to receive the most favorable tax advantage.
