WOODROW PHILLIPS - MAIN SPEAKER FOR NCC SPRING CONVENTION

We believe that our friends will be happy to know that Woodrow Phillips, President of San Jose Bible College, will be bringing the main addresses at our Annual Spring Convention.

Brother Phillips is an outstanding preacher with a rich background in education and experience. He was graduated from SJBC in 1946 and did additional study at Modesto Junior College, Jamaica Bible Seminary and Ozark Bible College receiving his Masters in Ministries from Ozark in 1974. In 1976 he was awarded a Ph.D. from the California Graduate School of Theology, University of So. California.

From 1950 to 1956 the Phillips served as missionaries in Jamaica. In 1956 he went to Ozark Bible College to head the School of Missions. During this term of service 117 missionaries were sent to the foreign fields and the department grew to a student body of 250 with seven faculty members.

In 1968 Brother Phillips accepted the call to serve as President of his alma mater, San Jose Bible College. Since that time he has seen the College grow to its highest enrollment in history.

Estate Planning Notes

Have you ever thought about the possibilities of giving to the College through Life Insurance? Most people have not. Yet there are varied ways to give substantial amounts and receive tax and other benefits at the same time.

FOR INSTANCE

It may be that you bought a policy for a specific purpose and now it is not needed. Such as — children's education, provide for old age retirement, to protect your business. Since you no longer have these needs the policy could be given by naming the College as the beneficiary.

Or you could name the College as a **co-beneficiary** and it would share in the proceeds of your policy.

Also you may want to give a substantial gift to the College but cannot because of inadequate funds. You **can** do so by buying a policy and making the small monthly or yearly payments. Thus you can make a \$1,000, \$5,000, or \$10,000 gift without too great a financial burden.

MANY ADVANTAGES IN GIVING THIS WAY

One advantage is that this policy is not a part of your estate and thus it will not need to wait for the settlement of your affairs. It will be paid immediately and directly to the College.

Since the above is true, there is a second advantage. There will be no probate costs or possible estate taxes. That savings can be considerable.

Another tax advantage can be realized. Since the College is made the owner of your policy — all your premium payments are deductible as charitable contributions each tax year.
