

Scholarship Funds Aid Needy NCC Students

Our College is young compared to some of our sister schools and has limited Scholarship Funds to assist students in need. Therefore we must be very discerning in giving scholarship monies to the most needy.

In the earlier years of the College there were no such funds. More recently brethren have found satisfaction in helping young people attain a Christian education that they might more effectively serve Christ. Some send in cash to be awarded to particular students. This is very helpful. Others have set up permanent Trust funds which provides for the use of the income from these monies with the principal remaining intact to continue to earn interest to be used year to year. The College, in this latter case, designates the recipient of such funds. The greatest need and a willingness to help himself are two prominent factors in determining the student who shall receive the award.
