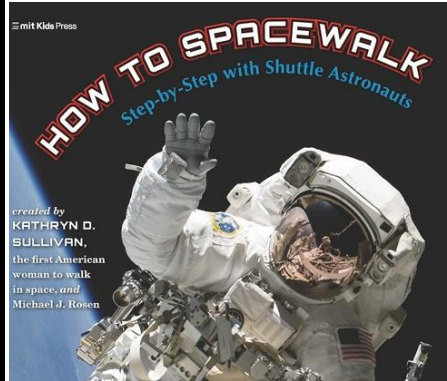

Beginning with her childhood, she relates how her parents encouraged her curiosity and helped her pursue the sciences. She studied geology, and she worked as an oceanographer. She became a pilot. Her wide interests and training provided her with the right experiences to be selected for NASA's astronaut corps. This book combines Sullivan's experience with a detailed description of her training, the space suit, and more. The photographs are amazing, and young readers will be fascinated by them. There are also drawings which add to the visual interest. This book is for older readers and would be a great addition to a library.
