I thank you for your good letter. In reference to work here all I can say is that there is plenty of carpenter work going on here and every body that wants a job has one so far as I can see, and I believe that you could be kept busy here all the time Carpenters get, I understand for \$2.50 to \$3.50 per day. There is considerable brick work going on here at the University of Florida, and when we ever get out College building started there will be more brick work there. Therefore I am of the opinion that you can get all the brick work you will see to fill in with, and between the two carpentering and brick laying you could do well here. Thats the way it looks to me. Maybe you had better run up here and look it over and let us go over the situation and let you decide for yourself. I would want a man too look over a place before I would insist on him coming. It suits me here, and has suited and is suiting thousands of others and we certainly have a good town, and a great school planned with brother Larimoer to teach the Bible and preach for us, and thats worth a great deal you know. I do really believe that you could pay for one of the 5 acre tracts by taking advantage of the terms \$200.00 cash and \$200 a year for four years, if you and yours know how to manage economically. I believe that any man who will work in Gainesville, or anywhere else for that matter will make a living. I think you can make a living here, and be better suited as to surroundings than you would there in Tampa.
