Dear Barney.

There are many things
that we will need here
that I feel compelled to
send for. I wrote to Mr.
Parker but he failed to get
the letter in time to
attend to the matters.
Please send, or rather
pack ready to send
when I let ^{you} know, ~~all~~
the Century Dictionary
and case, ~~all~~ of the
red books, "Famous Com-
posers and their works",
all the new music out
of the box couch in the

back room, but don't
pack any Trifet music.
Give the Trifet music
to Pearl if she wishes
it. Send by express "Sudds
National School of Music",
"Deviot Violin Method",
"Roots New Curriculum".
Send also by express the
book "Best Cultivation",
"Sessions in Grace", "Sessions
on voice culture". Pack
ready to send by freight
all my books in the
Book-Case. Pack all of
the music and music
books out of the desk.
Take the pegs out of the
old violin in the "Violin
Cabinet" and all the pegs

in the case and put them in the case with the beautiful red violin and have it well crated of course there must be cloth or cotton batting put around the violin before it is put in the case to keep it from being marred.

Be sure to ~~pack~~ "all the grades and music books of all descriptions.

Pack all of the new books from the top of the desk.

There is a manuscript in the bottom drawer in the dresser in the front room if Mrs

Parker hasn't taken
it. (Suppose you pack
every thing in boxes
ready for shipment by
freight except the things
specially mentioned. We
can do without the books
in the back room on the
shelves. How much I
wish I could be there
and attend to things.
Had I known I would
remain how different
things would have
been. Of course I don't
expect you to do this
without pay, but you
will be doing me the
greatest favor to see to
this for me. I was

so sorry Mr. Parker
didn't get my letter
in time to see to it
for me for it seems
to much to ask of
any body. We are
nicely situated here
but of course at a great
deal of expence. 'Tis
growing late and we
will have to hurry
to get this letter in
the mails. Much love
to your mother, brother
and all. Good-bye.
