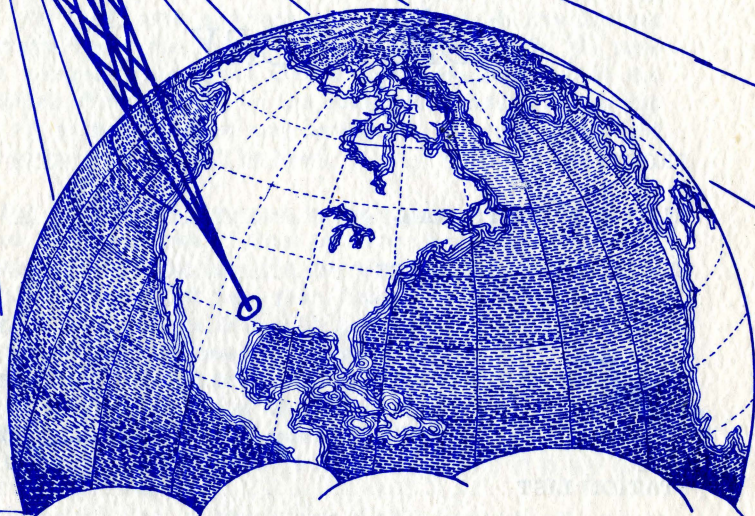

Brethren Willeford, McDonald, Patterson and I have traveled well over 20,000 miles and spoken to approximately five hundred congregations of the Church in the last three months. We have been inspired by the good that is being accomplished by the preaching of the gospel over the nation wide radio program and it is our prayer that good may continue to be accomplished and that no harm or evil will be done.

But the question foremost in the minds of our brethren is "What about next year?" First of all we have not talked with any congregation that supports the program this year that does not plan to support it next year. Some that do not support it this year plan to have fellowship in the work next year. Some plan to increase their support. Then someone says, "Everything must be fine," but that does not necessarily follow. It is not just enough for brethren to say they think that they will do certain things, but we need to know what they plan to do at once. There is a tendency many times to delay decisions until it is too late.

Therefore, I am making a very special appeal to all congregations that plan to have fellowship with us in the radio work next year to let us know at once what their plans are. We actually need to have this information by December 1. If we all work together, we can reach our goal of \$575,000, but we must act at once. The progress of this work depends upon you elders as you make your decisions for next year.

Substitutes of Brass

In the book of II Chronicles is found one of the most interesting stories in the Bible. Rehoboam, who had forsaken the law of the Lord along with all Israel, was then King of Jerusalem. Because of their sins God sent a prophet to Rehoboam and the princes of Judah and through the prophet God said, "Ye have forsaken me and therefore have I also left you in the hand of Shishak." Shishak was the king of Egypt, and we read that this monarch came against Jerusalem and took away the treasures of the house of Judah, and the treasures of the King's house. He also took away the shields of gold which Solomon had made.

In the temple in Jerusalem Solomon had hung three hundred shields of gold. He had beaten three pounds of gold into each of these. The three hundred shields were worth a half-million dollars. This glittering and enticing treasure had intrigued every conqueror of antiquity, but no man was able to take it from the house of God while His protection and care were upon it. It is no wonder that this Egyptian king considered his taking the shields of gold as his greatest achievement.

God permitted Jerusalem to be ransacked because Rehoboam "forsook the law of the Lord and all Israel with him," II Chronicles 12:1. So it was Rehoboam's failure that was in reality the cause of it all. When the king called the people back to God, and when he himself went to the temple for the purpose of prayer, those vacant walls, upon which the shields had once hung, haunted him. They had been put there by his father, and their absence was a constant reproach to him for his failures. So the troubled king had copies of these shields made, and since there was neither gold nor silver in the land it was necessary that these be made of brass. Thus a cheap imitation was made of brass, and these brazen shields were hung in place of the golden shields. Needless to say, brass is a poor substitute for gold.

The lessons which might be drawn from this touching incident are innumerable. But let us concern ourselves at this time with many of the golden facts of Christianity which have been forgotten by some and the doctrines of tarnished brass which have been substituted in their stead. In the first place, the golden fact of inspiration of the Holy Scriptures was a shield that hung in the heart of almost every professed believer of Christendom. It was believed that the Bible writers spoke as the Spirit gave them utterance, and that no prophecy ever came by the will of man, but that the holy men of God spoke as they were

moved by the Holy Spirit. The Bible was accepted as the word of God. In the minds of many this belief has been replaced by the humanistic substitute that the Bible is inspired in the same way that Shakespeare, Milton, and other great writers were inspired. It is now maintained by many that the men who penned the scriptures wrote their own opinions, and that what they wrote is their own interpretation of the Gospel. So it has developed that many today—hundreds of preachers included—do not believe the Bible is the Word of God, inspired and revealed by the Holy Spirit. The golden shield of faith in the Bible as the inspired Word of God has been removed, and a human production has been substituted for it.

Those who look upon the Bible as a human production forget the claims of the Bible writers who said time and time again that they were inspired of God. They seem oblivious to the many declarations within the Bible which say that it is the Word of God and not the word of men. Friends, we are convinced that the only way to account for the Bible is that it is Scripture inspired of God.

The golden fact of the Deity of Christ was once widely accepted by almost everyone who claimed the name "Christian" but not so in the 20th century. Many today say they believe Jesus was divine, but so are we all! Yes, when the golden shield of the Deity of Christ disappeared from the wall of many churches, the worshippers made a substitute of this brazen replica. They removed the Son of God and replaced Him with a son of man. Thus divinity was replaced by humanity, and an imposter takes the place of a loving Saviour. And it is indeed a miserable substitute for the divine assurance that Christ is God's only begotten Son. It is not enough to believe that Christ was a great man, and great teacher, or the smartest philosopher. He must be accepted for what He said He was, the Son of God. Jesus said, "If ye believe not that I am He, ye shall die in your sins." The apostle John said the word of God was written that "ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through His name," John 20:31. How can anyone profess to be a friend of Christ, and a believer in the Bible, and then reject such plain teaching! "The world cannot bury Christ. The earth is not deep enough for His tomb, the clouds are not wide enough for His shroud: He ascends into heavens, but the heavens cannot contain Him. He still lives—in the church which burns unconsumed with His love; and in the truth that reflects His image." (Edward Thompson).

The virgin birth of Christ was once widely accepted. Men believed the record God had given of the incarnation of His Son

that the body of Jesus was formed in the womb of the virgin Mary because of the direct visitation of the Holy Spirit. Thus the birth of Christ was a biological miracle and He owed even His earthly origin to His heavenly Father! This foundational fact has disappeared from the wall of many religious groups. And in the place of this golden fact there is a gastly and brazen substitute of an illegitimate child. And then men wonder that the old time greatness and power of the Christian faith seems lacking in many quarters today! Why should anyone disbelieve the virgin birth of Christ? Some say they do not believe it because it would be a miracle. Is there any greater mircale in God bringing life through one parent than in His law of procreation which brings life through two parents? One is no greater miracle than the other. It is interesting that God chose Luke, a reputable physician to bring the fullest account of the virgin birth of Christ. As a physician, he would be the first to question this miracle unless he was thoroughly convinced that it was true. The angel announced that He would be born of a virgin. Mary, the mother of Christ, called Him her Saviour. Joseph was so certain of her virginity that he took her to be his wife. When Elizabeth saw Mary she addressed her as the "mother of my Lord." God Himself explained the virgin birth by stating that He prepared a body for His Son, Heb. 10:5. The professed believer of the Bible may as well reject all of God's word as to reject this part of it.

In like manner the golden shield of redemption through the blood shed on Calvary has been stolen by the Enemy from many a church wall. The Bible teaches that Christ died—but it goes further than that. It not only teaches that Christ died, but that He died for our sins—that He died in order to make an atonement for the sins of the world. But the doctrine of the vicarious suffering and atonement is distasteful and obnoxious to multitudes of this present hour. They do not like the idea of a blood religion—Calvary is offensive to them—the cross is a stumbling block. They say Jesus died—certainly—but that His death was for the perfect example, or it was merely the death of a martyr for a great cause. And so the perfect example and a death of martyrdom are the substitutes of brass that men of our time are hanging in their temples in the place of the golden shield of redemption through the shed blood of the Lamb. These substitutes of brass are accepted in place of such golden shields as these: "In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace," Eph. 1:17. "But God commendeth His love to us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us," Rom. 5:8. "Unto Him that

loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood," Rev. 1:5. Instead of rejecting the sacrifice of Christ, we should say with the poet:

"On Thee alone my hope relies,
Beneath Thy cross I fall:
My Lord. My Life! My Sacrifice!
My Saviour! And my All!"

Another golden hield of Christianity which has been bartered for a shield of brass is the physical resurrection of Jesus. A misty idea of a spiritual resurrection has taken the place of His physical resurrection. The Bible record of the empty tomb, and the fact that Jesus appeared in a resurrected body mean nothing to unbelievers of this age. Nor do any of the other miracles of the Bible! They are explained away on natural grounds. Thousands who pose as believers in God see no miraculous element in the Bible, and to them the things which are there present as miraculous were the products of men's imaginations. The golden shield of Bible miracles has been taken down by the enemy, and has been replaced by the brass substitute of humanism and naturalism.

A few years ago twelve hundred preachers signed an affirmation which declares that it is not necessary for a minister to believe in the inerrant inspiration of the Scriptures, the virgin birth of Christ, the atonement, the bodily resurrection, and the miracles of Christ. Notice what golden shields are here named. The virgin birth, the atonement, the resurrection and the miracles! What have we left in the Christian religion? If the golden shields are taken away, what remains? The answer is obvious—we have in their places substitutes of brass.

The Bible has not changed; nor has it been disproved. We ask the world's scholarship to bring one known fact which makes the Bibue any less credible now than it was nineteen hundred years ago. The men who lived with Christ and observed His miracles said, "ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs which God did by Him in the midst of you as ye yourselves also know," Acts 2:22. And again, "For we have not followed cunningly devised fables, when we made known unto you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of His Majesty," II Peter 1:16. These men saw the miracles of Christ performed, and they said there can be no doubt. They died testifying that they spoke the truth. Unbelievers now deny what eyewitnesses strongly affirmed to be true.

Even the contemporary enemies of Christ could not deny

the miracles performed by Him and His disciples. The Pharisees said, "What shall we do to these men? For that indeed a notable miracle hath been done by them is manifest to all them that dwell in Jerusalem and we cannot deny it," Acts 4:16. Once a man in a Bible class said he found it hard to credit the accounts of Jesus' miraculous healings; and the teacher, a blunt, practical manufacturer, replied, "I never knew a man who could create a machine who was not able also to repair it." Then he told of watching a wireless control for an automobile, the operation of which seemed almost unbelievable, "If men can do things like this why should any man doubt the miracles wrought by the son of God!"

We talk much about faith, and it is well that we should. It is not faith in the theories of men, but it is faith in Jesus as the Son of God. If I believe in Christ, I believe all that the Bible says about Him, from His miraculous birth to His resurrection from the dead and His ascension into Heaven. It is faith in His word that led me to repent of my sins and be buried with Him in baptism. Genuine faith in Him and love for Him will lead any sincere person to do the same. Jesus said, "If a man love me he will keep my words: and my Father will love him and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him," John 14:23. John said, "this is the love of God that we keep His commandments: and His commandments are not grievous," I John 5:3.

Storm-tossed, troubled, tempted soul, will you hear the knocking of Christ's pierced hand upon the door of your heart. He will take hold of your hand and bring you through all the storms of life, over the wild waves, and past the dangerous rocks to your desired haven. He needs you, and you need Him. We ask you to obey His word and let Him come into your heart and life, today.

David Did It

Once a man came to my study and asked, "Why do we not offer animal sacrifices, and burn incense in worship?" David did it!" This man expressed a concept that is quite common in the religious world. Many things are now done in religion because David did them. Churches of Christ do not justify any religious act by David's practice, because he lived under the law of Moses and we are not under that law. We are under the law of Christ. The Bible says David had several wives. Does this mean we may practice polygamy because David did it? Who will defend polygamy by such reasoning? David lived under God's old covenant which permitted the burning of incense and the offering of animal sacrifices, but we are living under the gospel of Christ, and it authorizes none of these things.

May we perform any religious act simply because David did it? To answer this question we must learn one thing—is the Old Testament binding upon us today? If it is, and we have an approved example of David performing a religious act, we may do the same thing. But if the Old Law is not in force now we may not do anything simply because David did it.

In Jeremiah 31:31, we read, "Behold, the days come, saith the Lord, that I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel, and with the house of Judah." In the New Testament Paul says this prophecy was fulfilled in the giving of a better covenant. The better covenant is the law of Christ and it was established upon a better promise. Christ took away "the first that he might establish the second," Hebrews 10:9. Language could not be plainer.

In Gal. 3:19 Paul asked, "Wherefore then serveth the law? It was added because of transgressions, till the seed should come." In Gal. 3:16 Paul said the seed is Christ. So the law was to last till the coming of Christ, and sometime during His sojourn upon the earth it was to be abolished. In Col. 2:14 the Holy Spirit said the handwriting of ordinances was blotted out and nailed to the cross. This settles the matter once and for all! The old law died at the cross. Christ said He had not come to destroy the law but to fulfill it. On the cross He fulfilled it, and took it out of the way. We do not practice anything in religion simply because Moses did it. On the mount of transfiguration God said, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; hear ye Him," Matt. 17:5. As God's spokesman, Moses and Elijah gave way to the Son of God's love.

When the Lord said the old law was done away just what was included? Did He mean that some of the Old Testament was abolished, but that a part of it is still in force? We find the answer to this question in the seventh chapter of Romans. After citing marriage as an illustration, Paul shows that while the husband lives, the wife cannot be married to another man without adultery; but if the husband be dead, the marriage union is thereby dissolved, and she is free to be married to another man. He thus applies this to the relation of Christians to the law. He said, "Wherefore, my brethren, ye also are become dead to the law by the body of Christ; that ye should be married to another, even to him who is raised from the dead, that we should bring forth fruit unto God . . . But now we are delivered from the law, that being dead wherein we were held. . ." Romans 7:4, 6.

Just as death dissolved a former marriage so the death of Christ dissolved all relationship with the law of God given on Mount Sinai. In Romans 7:7 Paul quotes the command "Thou shalt not covet," and thus he identifies the Ten Commandments as a part of the law which is dead.

No partial change in the law could be made. Jesus said no change as slight as even "one jot or one tittle" should occur "till all things be accomplished," Matt. 5:17, 18. A "jot" is the dot of an "i" and a "tittle" is the cross of a "t." This insured the Decalogue to stand as it was given. Yet, in the New Testament nine of the ten commandments are given in changed form, the very thing Jesus said should not be done "till" the whole law should be fulfilled or accomplished. We believe, therefore, that such a change proves that all of the law was abolished.

The ten commandments were engraved upon stones and Paul says that which was engraved upon stones "is done away in Christ," 2 Cor. 3:14.

The Holy Spirit instructed Paul to write, "Now that no man is justified by the law before God, is evident: for, The righteous shall live by faith; and the law is not of faith: but, He that doeth them shall live in them. Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law," Gal. 3:11-13. In this passage the law is called a curse and the Holy Spirit said we are redeemed from it. By inspiration Paul said "the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after that faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster," Gal. 3:24-25. The entire Old Testament was to prepare men for the coming of Christ. It was temporary; not permanent. When it served its purpose in bringing men to Christ, it ceased as a law for the Lord's people.

The Holy Spirit guided the writer of the book of Hebrews to say, "For the priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change also of the law," Heb. 7:12. This verse says a change from the old law to the gospel of Christ was a necessity. Christ as our High Priest was of the tribe of Judah, Heb. 7:14. Of this tribe no one could be a priest while the old law stood. The priest was the one who offered the sacrifice for sin. Christ's sacrifice for our sins could not be accepted, therefore, until the old law could be changed; and no change would be tolerated until the whole should be "fulfilled," Matt. 5:17, 18. The complete abolishment of the law as given on Mount Sinai was **necessary**, therefore, in order that Christ might be our Saviour. Instead of saving men, the old law, had it remained, would have prevented salvation. That is why it was nailed to the cross, and a much better covenant was given in its place.

We do not justify anything by what David did, for he lived under a testament that is not in force. God required many things of him that He does not require of us. Being an Israelite, David had to make three trips to Jerusalem each year to offer sacrifices to God. Does the Lord expect us to do the same thing because David did it? Surely reason and revelation answer, No.

Some suggest that all the Old Testament was nailed to the cross except the Psalms of David. But we know the Psalms were a part of the law for Christ quotes from them and identifies His quotations as coming from the law. The Lord said, "But this cometh to pass, that the word might be fulfilled that is written in their law, They hated me without a cause," John 15:25. This statement is quoted from Psalms 35:19. Christ says the Psalms were a part of the old law. And since the old law was taken away, man is not to be governed today by the Psalms, for they were a part of the law.

A distinction is sometimes made also, between the law of Moses and the law of God. Those who make this distinction say the law of Moses was done away but the law of God remains. However, this distinction is made where there is no difference. In Neh. 10:29 the writer said, "They clave to their brethren, their nobles, and entered into a curse, and into an oath, to walk in God's law, which was given by Moses, the servant of God." The Lord makes no distinction between His law and that of Moses. They were the same. Nehemiah said, "and they spake unto Ezra the scribe to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded to Israel . . . So they read in the book of the law of God distinctly, and gave the sense, and caused them to understand the reading." Neh. 8:1, 8. The law of Moses and the law of God were one and the same. When the law was

nailed to the cross, this included every command from Genesis to Malachi. Not one is now binding upon us unless it was incorporated within the new. We are subject to the will of Christ, for it is "a better covenant, which was established upon better promises," Heb. 8:6.

Now, let us make some practical applications of this lesson. There were some things Christ did during His personal ministry on earth that we should not observe now. The Lord was born a Jew, and as a Jew He was obligated to keep the law of Moses. He kept the Jewish feasts, such as the Passover, but we do not keep it for we were never under the law that required it. Christ was circumcised as a religious rite, but after Christ died the Holy Spirit said, "if ye be circumcised, Christ shall profit you nothing," Gal. 5:2. Luke says that when Jesus was eight days old his parents "brought him to Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord . . . And to offer a sacrifice according to that which is said in the law of the Lord, a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons," Luke 2:22, 24. Even though this sacrifice was recorded in the New Testament it is not binding upon Christians for it was offered in obedience to the law of Moses.

Since the law was abolished we cannot justify any religious practice by it. We do not observe the seventh-day sabbath for it was a part of the old law. Under Christ we have a new day of worship, the Lord's day, which is the first day of the week, Acts 20:7.

Churches of Christ do not justify the use of instrumental music in worship by saying David did it. If David's use of instrumental music under the law of Moses justifies us in using it then all that David did would be right for us to do. But the Psalmist offered animal sacrifices, burned incense and did many other things we would not dream of doing.

Observing one command of the law would bind a person to the whole. Paul says, "For I testify again to every man that is circumcized, that he is debtor to do the whole law," Gal. 5:3. No principle is more clearly stated in the scriptures than this: that a person who goes back to the Old Testament for one religious practice is bound to keep all the law. And yet if we go back to the old law Paul says "Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law," Gal. 5:4. Let us then come to the will of Christ for all our religious instruction, for His gospel is better and more glorious than the old covenant. The Old Testament was inspired of God and it is profitable for us to read, but it is not binding upon us. We are now under the law of the spirit of life in Christ Jesus.

In the first century, some Christians thought they had to

obey the Old Testament and the New, but to these disciples Paul wrote, "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage," Gal. 5:1. To return to the old covenant or any part of it brings men into spiritual bondage.

Paul says the sacrifices of the old law could never perfect the worshipers. It was necessary that Christ provide for us a "new and living way, which he hath consecrated for us, through the veil, that is to say, his flesh," Heb. 10:20. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father but by me." In Christ we are new creatures.

When Queen Victoria was being shown through a paper mill in England, she came to a large pile of filthy and blackened rags. She asked the foreman what he would do with such rags. He said he could make them into the finest, whitest paper ever manufactured. Some days afterward there was received at the palace a package of the purest, most delicate white paper with the Queen's likeness woven into each sheet. A note from the foreman said this paper had been made from the filthy rags the Queen had asked about on her visit. So lives blackened by sin, God can make whiter than snow, with Christ's own likeness stamped where Satan's had been. No life is hopelessly beyond the transforming power of God's Son. Christ offers us the truth which can make us free. Paul said to the Roman Christians, "ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you. Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness," Romans 6:17, 18. In the doctrine of Christ the Lord said we must believe in Him, repent of our sins, and be immersed unto the remission of those sins. Will you do these things today and be made free in Christ?

Marriage and Divorce

He hands her the rope, and she pulls with all her might, but the heavy bell will not turn. The preacher then turns to the groom and asks that he lend a hand and help his bride. Together they pull and the bell turns, sending out over the countryside the news of another wedding. Then the minister says: "As you go out into life, never forget that as long as you pull together, you can RING THE BELL!"

This is certainly good advice to newlyweds who are beginning the most beautiful and the most difficult of all human achievements, learning to live and work together.

The Bible truth about marriage should be taught and emphasized a much greater degree. Young people should be forewarned that they may be forearmed for this great task of life. We must come to respect God's will and listen to His instruction on marriage. He made us and surely He knows what is best for us.

When we turn to the Bible we learn that marriage is of divine origin. It must be respected and revered as a divine relationship. In the first book of the Bible we find these words regarding marriage, "And the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept, and He took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof. And the rib, which the Lord had taken from man, made He a woman, and brought her unto the man. And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of man. Therefore, shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh." (Gen. 2:21-24.) From these verses it is evident that marriage as an institution for man's happiness originated in the mind of God. It preceded society, and is therefore not to be thought of as originating with society. Sociologists sometime say we do not know the origin of the family, but the second chapter of Genesis sets forth its origin. The Bible is unimpeachable as inspired word of God, and I am perfectly willing to accept its explanation as to the origin of marriage.

In providing a help mate for man the Great Surgeon per-

formed the first operation after putting the patient to sleep. In performing this operation God took woman from man's side which act teaches that she is to be his companion, and not his master nor his slave. And, as companions, the husband and wife become one and are to walk hand in hand to face the duties and experiences of life together.

The Bible teacher that in marriage the husband and wife have a mutual obligation. After the creation of Adam God said, "I will make a help meet for him." This means a help that is suitable, a partner, a companion. In the fifth chapter of Ephesians Paul gave the mutual obligation of husband and wife to one another. He said to the wives, "Submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord." To the husbands the Lord said, "Love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and gave himself for it. So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies." Then the Lord gave a summation of the mutual obligations of a husband and a wife in these words, "Nevertheless, let every one of you in particular so love his wife as himself; and the wife see that she reverence her husband."

When two married people obey the Lord's instructions the husband will love his wife as Christ loved the church, and the wife will reverence her husband. If we follow the Lord's instructions, marriage will succeed.

The Bible makes it clear that marriage is for life. When this union takes place the husband and wife become one flesh, and this bond should be maintained until death. To the Lord the marriage gates swing only one way. In the beginning the Lord said that each man was to have one wife and each wife was to have one husband. This thought is found in both the Old and New Testaments. In Gen. 2:24 the Lord said that the two become one flesh, and in I Cor. 7:2 the apostle Paul said by inspiration, "Let every man have his own wife, and let every woman have her own husband." In Matt. 19:6 Christ said, "Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder." It is sinful for the husband to do anything that will dissolve this union, and it is wrong for the wife to do anything that will break this bond. Certainly it is sin of the deepest dye for a third person to do anything that will bring about a separation of a husband and his wife. When the Lord said two people become one flesh and are not to be separated He was speaking plainly. The relationship between a husband and wife is closer than that which exists between a parent and child. The two have no independent rights, privileges, cares or concerns, but their obligations are mutual.

After God created Adam He said, "It is not good that the man should be alone. I will make a help meet for him," Gen 2:18. This pronouncement of God is very definite. It is not good that man should be alone. It is far better for every person to have a faithful companion for life. The inspired writer of the Hebrew letter said, "Marriage is honorable in all," Heb. 13:4. God warned that the time would come when some would speak "lies in hypocrisy," having their conscience seared with a hot iron; Forbidding to marry and commanding to abstain from meats." (I Tim. 4:2-3.) In both the Old and New Testaments God commanded marriage in all. We should all speak as the Oracles of God.

One purpose of Marriage is to bring greater happiness to people in creating a family. There is no unit of society comparable to a good family and a good home. It is complete within itself. That is why the Lord said, "Therefore, shall a man leave his father and his mother and shall cleave unto his wife." The husband and his wife are to be the parents of a new family. They are to build a home filled with love and kindness.

When parents fail to provide the right kind of home the consequences are too many to be properly assessed. No one can fully count the cost of this failure. One of the saddest pictures I have ever seen appeared in the New York papers a few years ago. A little boy was standing behind an old abandoned shed near the river, and a policeman stood by him. The policeman was pointing to a large mansion upon the hill and asking the boy "Why don't you go home?" The lad replied, "I have no home." The policeman then asked, as he pointed to the mansion on the hill, "Isn't that your home?" And the broken-hearted boy said, "That's where my dad comes after a drunk. Mother says he is still all 'tead' up. That is where mother comes after long hours at the dances and clubs. That ain't home, that's just a house."

The unknown poet truly said,

"Home is where the heart is,

In dwellings great or small:

And there is many a stately mansion

That isn't a home at all;

And a cottage lighted with love light

Is the dearest home of all."

When a marriage fails a home is destroyed, a family broken, children are saddened, and the Lord is displeased. In Mal. 2:16 God thundered against divorce in these words, "I hate putting away." To the men of Israel He said in effect, "It is useless for you to bring your offerings and put them on the altar, for the

altar is too wet with the tears of the wives with whom you have 'dealt treacherously'." By divorce Judah had "profaned the holiness of God."

In the New Testament Jesus gave adultery as the only scriptural reason for a husband or wife to be divorced from the other, and all the laws of man cannot change the law of God. In the Bible there is just one lawful reason for obtaining a divorce; in the United States there are twenty-three legal excuses for such action. These grounds range all the way from mental cruelty to adultery. Many of these grounds cannot even be defined. Who knows the meaning of mental cruelty? One judge granted a wife divorce on the basis of cruelty because her husband made light of her hats!

The tragedy of divorce is well illustrated in a story that appeared in the Capital Times of Madison, Wisconsin. The police found a little thirteen year old boy and his dog living on a vacant lot. According to Capt. Milstead of the detective bureau, the lad either did not know his address, or for some reason would not give it. He was lost and bewildered, not knowing where to turn. His explanation was that his parents were divorced and both had remarried.

Marriage should be religious in spirit. Christ performed His first miracle at a marriage in Cana of Galilee. At our marriages today let us send our first invitation to Him, for when marriages shall be entered into in that spirit, there will be fewer divorces in the land. Even in marriage we must put Christ in the most prominent place!

The family is the strongest unit of society and the home is the citadel of civilization. It is the bulwark of Christianity, and it is the basic need and the chief asset of every nation. In a Christian home the husband and wife will honor one another, and the children will be taught to obey their parents and to respect the word of God. A truly Christian home will be a beacon light from which the rays of love and purity will ever shine.

Marriage is for life. It is not for a month, a year, or a dozen years. It is not to last until the first quarrel, or the hundredth quarrel, but until the very sunset of life. The husband should realize that the flowers carried by the bride on her wedding day are just as sacred as those that will lie upon her still heart when the journey of life is over. Marriage is a permanent relationship, "for better or for worse, for richer or for poorer, in sickness and health till death do us part."

Marriage is so sacred and dear to God's heart that He pictures His church as married to His Son. In Rom. 7:4 the Lord says His people are married to Christ that they may bring forth

fruit unto God. The church is described as a bride adorned for her husband. Paul said, "Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and gave himself for it; That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish," Eph. 5:25-27. The Lord said through His apostle that the church is sanctified and cleansed with the washing of water by the word. In the second chapter of Acts we see how this is done. The apostle preached to men who had crucified Christ. The sermon brought conviction to their hearts, and they cried, "Men and brethren, what shall we do?" Peter said, "Repent and be baptized everyone of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins." Luke says three thousand of them were baptized, and the Lord added them to the church. Thus God sanctified and cleansed these people with the washing of water by the word, and at that time they were added to the church by the Lord. That is why these things are necessary. We must all believe, repent and be baptized if we are to be united with Christ, and presented to him in that final day of all days. The Lord waits. Will you come to him now?

Religious Racketeering

Quite often I've heard the statements, "Religion is a racket," and "All preachers are racketeers." These charges are made in connection with the plea for money. I am forced to admit that there is some truth in each of these charges. Nothing is accomplished by denying it. There is some racketeering in religion!

Many devices are invented to raise money for religious purposes. In Wisconsin a church carnival was held to raise money. A mouse was placed in the center of a circle of tin cans with the open ends of the cans turned toward the mouse. They were numbered and the people wagered on the can into which the mouse would run when turned loose. By such means money was raised for religious purposes. It is a fact known to the world that many churches hold Bingo parties to fill their coffers.

In a New Mexico town the annual custom is followed by one church of having a large scale in front of the building, and each member is weighed and charged a penny per pound to enter the building for worship.

In 1938 a church in North Carolina held a hugging party in the basement of the building to swell its budget. One dollar was charged for a man to embrace another man's wife, and ten cents was charged for embracing a single girl. (Readers Digest, March 1938). Such an incident would be amusing if it did not involve matters of eternal concern!

In several large cities of our country, churches have applied in writing for beer and whiskey licenses! Why? To raise money in the name or religion! Do you wonder that many say, "Religion is a racket?"

It is an every-day occurrence for a church to serve a supper in its basement to enrich its treasury. The ladies give of their money at services, and then they are called upon to do double duty by serving a meal that the church may have the proceeds.

In Madison, Wisconsin, there are three religious groups which receive money from the United Givers Fund. These churches set up a welfare agency and then ask everyone to contribute to it, even business men who do not believe in Christ. Such begging campaigns by these groups belittle the teaching of Christ. They make Christianity look like a ragged beggar with his hand out!

I am sure that most of you dislike these practices in religion. Doubtless you long to see something better take their place, and perhaps you are working to that end. There is a far better way

of financing the Lord's work set forth in the New Testament.

A group of ladies once asked Roger Babson, the economist, to suggest a new way for the mto raise money for the church. His prompt and pointed reply was, "Why not try religion?"

What we have said in this lesson about racketeering is not meant to discourage giving, for the Lord requires us to give. He has provided a way that **does not** involve racketeering! The Lord directed Paul to say, "Upon the first day of the week, let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come," I Cor. 16:1-2. From other passages in the New Testament we learn that Christians assembled regularly upon the first day of the week to worship. The Lord instructed that our giving be done at that time as part of our worship. Every Christian is to give upon the first day of the week as he has been prospered. This divine arrangement will eliminate all pressure campaigns, church bazaars, and gambling schemes to raise money. We know the Lord's plan will work because it worked during the early centuries before racketeering was started among religious people. The Lord's plan is working today among churches of Christ. When Christians give upon the Lord's day as they assemble for worship, and give according to their ability, the manner of giving is simple and the amount adequate. There is no excuse for assessing the members, and resorting to unscriptural ways to raise money. In the church of the Lord no man can tell another member how much he should give; but for his giving to please the Lord it must be a willing service. Paul said, "For if there be first a willing mind, it is accepted according to that a man hath, and not according to that he hath not," II Cor. 8:12. The Lord further says in reference to giving, "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give: not grudgingly, or of necessity; for God loveth a cheerful giver," II Cor. 9:7. When one sees the high pressure methods employed to extract money from people he can well understand why many give reluctantly. If all racketeering would cease and men would resort to the Lord's plan, much more would be given for the Lord's work.

Sometimes we hear people speak of "giving till it hurts," but very few do it. Many, however, "keep till it hurts." Can you imagine anyone more miserable than the greedy, grasping miser who hoards his money in some secret place for fear it will be found and spends anxious days and sleepless nights guarding it! Stinginess will destroy your love for humanity and cause you to rob God by withholding that which is His. (Mal. 3:8.)

There are numerous examples of the vanity, futility and foolishness of "Laying up treasures on earth, where moth and

rust do corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal." The prize fool of the universe was the rich man mentioned in Luke 12 who selfishly sought to lay up treasures to satisfy his own lusts, but was "not rich toward God." The true aim of life is not to GET but to GIVE, not to be ministered unto, but to minister. Paul said, "Let him that stole steal no more: But rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth." Eph. 4:28.

We should be liberal in our giving because "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights," James 1:17. In the Old and new Testaments, we read that "The earth is the Lord's and the fulness thereof." Man is a steward. Nothing that he possesses is his own. The Lord requires us to give to His cause that He may possess our hearts. He says, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also," Matt. 6:21.

How much does God expect us to give? As we study His word we learn that Christ gave His life, the poor widdow gave her living, the Jerusalem Christians gave houses and lands. Zacceus gave one-half, and the Macedonians gave "of their poverty." Paul says of these disciples in Macedonia, "For according to their power, I bear witness, yea and beyond their power they gave of their own accord," II Cor. 8:3. I fear that most Christians today give of their abundance, and fail to sacrifice as did those Christians of Macedonia. The New Covenant stresses maximums and not minimums. We should do all we can in the Lord's work.

I should be ashamed and afraid to give any less than God required of His people in the Old Testament days! He required at least a tithe from Israel. May we give less? We should not place our giving on a percentage basis, however, for our limit should be our ability. This principle guided the early disciples in their giving. (Acts 11:29.) The word ability is not difficult to understand. If we say a man has the ability to be governor we mean he is qualified, or able. When the Lord instructs us to give according to our ability He is telling us to give as we have been prospered, not as little as we can. If I am able to give ten dollars and I give seven or eight I have not given in harmony with God's will.

A few years ago our legislators in Washington passed an income tax law. When these men came to the question of how much to allow for religious contributions it was decided that fifteen percent would be fair. It has always been a challenge to me that our National Congress composed of many irreligious and worldly men should set a figure for our giving which is much

higher than that reached by the average American citizen. As George Wiseman has well said,

"It is not what we earn that makes us rich
As riches are really known,
But how honest we are as we lay our hand
On what we call our own.
It is not what we keep that gives us peace
In an age when peace is rare,
But how truthful we are as we lay aside
Our own and the Master's share."

Not only does racketeering creep into the method of raising money but it also enters into the spending of it. Many religious groups seem perfectly unaware of what God says. When money is contributed to the Lord's treasury it is to be used in preaching the gospel, and in helping the needy. The Lord did not design the church to be a recreational organization, and insurance company, or a political party.

There are many promises made to those who give scripturally. In the Old Testament the Lord said to his people, "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse . . . and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive," Mal. 3:10. Jesus said, "Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete it shall be measured to you again." (Luke 6:38). A faithful Christian was asked why it was that he managed to get by so well financially and give so much to the Lord's work. "Oh," he said, "I just keep shovelling it out and He keeps shovelling it in; and the Lord has a bigger shovel than I have."

We need more sacrificial giving. America spent nine billion dollars last year for intoxicating drinks. It gave one billion dollars to promote the cause of righteousness in our land. A German woman who is a member of the church in Heidelberg, Germany, makes \$45.00 per month as a scrub-woman. She gives one-third of her income in support of the Lord's work. She wraps her gift in tissue paper so as to avoid embarrassing the other members who are not giving as much. What an example for most Christians in America!

Many of us are like the little boy playing in the sands along the seashore. He was building a city in the sand. He laid out the streets, built the houses, stores, banks, and wall. Outside the wall he laid out highways and roads, farms and farm houses. All afternoon he worked building his city. He did not notice that the sun was setting, the clouds were gathering, and that the

wind was growing chill. He was too busy with his city. He did not notice that the tide was coming in, the waves mounting higher and higher, until one wave mightier than the rest, came sweeping in about him, washing away his houses and his lands. his city and his farms. In terror, the child ran back alone and afraid. And so we all play upon the sands. So intent do we become that we do not notice that the evening draws near, that the clouds are filling the sky, that the wind is growing chill, that the tide of death is coming in, until suddenly it races over us, sweeping away from us all our earthly possessions.

The riches we use for life's necessities are consumed, the riches we hoard are lost, but the riches we share with others are saved. Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive," and those who are liberal can testify that this is true. Christ set the great example of giving. Paul said, "For we know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich," II Cor. 8:9. Paul is speaking of Christian giving. He reminds us of Christ's unspeakable gift. The apostles used the grace of God and the love of Christ as an incentive and guide to Christian giving. If our Lord sacrificed His life we should sacrifice in our giving.

Jesus lived and died that we might die and live. In His death He purchased our redemption, and we come into the benefits of His death by baptism. Paul says, "Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death?" Romans 6:3. Your faith in the Lord should lead you to repent of your sins and to be buried with Christ in the watery grave of baptism.

Every day remember that you have a God to glorify; a Saviour to imitate, a soul to save, virtue to acquire, heaven to seek, eternity to meditate upon, temptations to resist, the world to guard against, and judgment to meet.

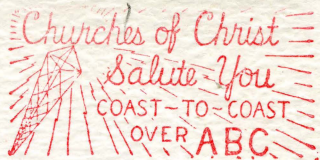
