

Book Review: STONE AGE BEASTS

This colorful and detailed nonfiction book highlights 18 different animals living in the prehistoric forests of the Stone Age. It starts with a table of contents and an introduction to the Stone Age. Each creature has a double-page spread with realistic illustrations and details about their size, location, and when they became extinct. The woolly mammoth is presented with bolded font to highlight its name, and the entry includes inserted text boxes with specific facts followed by a double-spaced narrative for more explanation. Each spread has a different color for variety. A nice, informative glossary is included in the back to provide further guidance. There are lots of details, but they are not overwhelming!
