Scope and Content Note: This collection includes notes, charts, newspaper clippings, debate materials, and photographs from Charles Ready Nichol.

Biographical Note: Charles Ready Nichol was a Church of Christ minister, debater, and writer. He was born 26 March 1876 near Murfreesboro, Tennessee. He was educated at the Nashville Bible School, Southwest Kentucky College, Vanderbilt University, and Transylvania University. He married Harriet "Hattie" Thompson Helm in 1896. He began preaching in Woodbury, Tennessee in 1891 and continued his work in numerous other places, often holding protracted meetings. He is perhaps best known for his work with R. L. Whiteside in producing the multi-volume series of *Sound Doctrine* books. These remain in print and were widely used in Bible classes in Churches of Christ. Nichol often wrote for church papers such as *Gospel Advocate* and *Firm Foundation*. He wrote 21 books and in 1948 received an honorary doctor's degree from Abilene Christian College. Nichol died in 1961 and was buried in the Clifton Cemetery in Clifton, Texas.
